














AS A NEW PHASE IN AN ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECT FOSTERING HOPE – Environmental artist ELIZABETH OGILVIE and artist-filmmaker ROBERT PAGE are launching the third phase of their collaborative environmental project, INTO THE OCEANIC | CONVERSATION WITH OUR OCEAN.

This project aims to raise awareness and inspire action regarding the critical role of our oceans in tackling the climate emergency. Ogilvie, known for her experiential installations using water and video, and Page, whose work explores the intersection of documentary filmmaking and fine art with a focus on human impact on the environment, have been working together for over 20 years and collaborating for nearly 10. – Their joint commissions, films, and artworks underscore their shared environmental convictions and engage audiences in crucial dialogues about environmental issues.

INTO THE OCEANIC is built upon the understanding that oceans hold key solutions to the climate crisis. Blue carbon ecosystems, including kelp forests, plankton, seagrass, and salt marshes, play a vital role in carbon sequestration. Seagrass, for example, can store carbon up to 35 times faster than rainforests, and salt marshes outperform terrestrial forests by a factor of 50.

"While the science behind blue carbon offers immense potential for positive change, public awareness is crucial to drive action," says Ogilvie.

"Art serves as a powerful tool to foster agency and inclusion, communicating complex cultural and philosophical concepts in an accessible way."

Since 2020, Ogilvie and Page have collaborated with leading scientists at The Scottish Oceans Institute, producing the first phase of INTO THE OCEANIC, featuring public events and large-scale video projections during the COP26 climate conference in Glasgow.

Their collaboration continues to deepen with scientists such as WILLIAM AUSTIN, Chairman of Blue Carbon Scotland and Professor at St Andrews University. Austin recently established the Blue Carbon Research Centre (BCRC), uniting the research capabilities of four university schools: Chemistry, Geography, Biology, and the Scottish Oceans Institute.

Ogilvie and Page have been appointed as the first artists-in-residence at the BCRC, granting them unique access to real-time, groundbreaking research data. This residency underscores the importance of interdisciplinary collaboration in addressing climate change.

"Tackling climate change requires a post-normal science approach, extending beyond traditional collaborations between oceanographers, meteorologists, and other scientists," explains Page.

"The involvement of artists and creative thinkers is essential. By introducing new modes of thinking and communicating innovative developments, we can catalyze positive change."

Elizabeth Ogilvie is an environmental artist creating experiences for her public. Her practice is a fusion of art architecture and science, and water and ice are currently both medium and subject in the work Ogilvie is one of the most significant artists of her generation in Scotland with a compelling vision and strong track record in realizing projects of scale and critical public engagement. The success of Bodies of Water lies with Ogilvie's commitment to her audience enabling them to interact with, experience/explore one of our most precious natural resources. Through series of installations viewer is offered opportunity to share in Ogilvie's experience of sensorial engagement within environment. The effect of the work is then to affect. Bodies of Water/ Dundee Contemporary Arts. She aims to create an experience of seeing, drawing people in through senses.

### **AWARDS**

Ogilvie received a £25K Creative Scotland/National Lottery Award with which artist transformed a derelict dockside warehouse into a major installation for public engagement, a recent major grant [£50K] for three years work on research/output, Out of Ice, grant from Arts Council of England [£30K] towards Out of Ice, P3. She received a Saltire Award for Art in Architecture, in addition to Trust Awards, further Creative Scotland awards and granted residencies abroad. Ogilvie has formerly acted as specialist advisor for Creative Scotland.

I describe my work as a fusion of documentary filmmaking and fine art and in recent years this has become increasingly focused on the human impact, both positive and negative, on the environment. First, simply I look, taking time to observe, and only when I have a true sense of the subject, I use the camera to capture and share, often unfiltered, that which I see with the unknown viewer. I constantly draw inspiration from the people I meet and crucially the stories that we all have to tell; the experiences that make us and shape us, as a society and as individuals.
